- **prairieflora.com** Manitoba native plant nursery in Teulon, Great selection of potted native prairie plants and heirloom vegetables grown from local seed; native landscape design services and information.
- <u>prairieoriginals.com</u> Manitoba native plant and seed nursery in East Selkirk with an extensive catalog of native Manitoba species. Spring/summer plant sales at St. Norbert Farmers Market and at some Winnipeg garden centres; native landscape information, planting advice and wildflower books.
- **psbotanicals.com** Manitoba's newest native plant nursery near Gardenton in the Tall Grass Prairie Preserve area. Botanist Laura Reeves also offers workshops and natural area inventories.
- **skinnernativeseeds.net** Native prairie grass and wildflower seeds from western Manitoba, Saskatchewan and midwestern USA.

  drawings of most of our Tall Grass Prairie plants; out of print but available from libraries and online used book sources
- Prairie Grasses (J. Looman, Agriculture Canada) The standard reference book for western
  Canadian grasses, both native and non-native; excellent black& white line drawings, with habitat
  and distribution information. Available from libraries and on-line used book sources; a digitized
